The Family Services Department has responsibility for delivery of Children's Centre services in the south of the borough including family support in the home, targeted group work, a fathers support programme, a toy library and parenting courses.

Four new members of staff who have recently joined us at the Pre-School Learning Alliance, Lewisham.

Children & Young People Improved Access to Psychological Therapies (CYP IAPT) programme.

The Children and Young People's Improved Access to **Psychological Therapies** programme (CYP IAPT) is a service transformation programme delivered by NHS England that aims to improve existing Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) working in the community. The programme works to transform services provided by the NHS and partners from Local Authority and the Third Sector that together form local area CAMHS Partnerships. The programme began in 2011 and has a target to work with CAMH services that cover 60% of the 0-19 population by March 2015.

Towards the end of 2013 Lewisham CAMHS, LB Lewisham, the Pre-school Learning Alliance Lewisham and Place 2 Be formed a partnership which was approved to participate in the 3rd Wave of the CYP IAPT programme. The partnership is linked to a Higher **Educational Institution (HEI)** which provides training to staff, following the CYP IAPT National Curriculum. This involved staff being trained to deliver either **CBT** or the Incredible Years Programme and Parent Child Game. CAMHS Partnerships that are part of the programme are also given resources to improve participation by children, young people and

their families in service delivery and design, and to carry out session by session routine outcome monitoring (ROM). From January 2015, the partnership will be delivering services, with PSLA Lewisham providing the following 2 programmes:

PARENT CHILD GAME

The PCG is an intensive parenting programme in which carers/parents are coached by a parenting practitioner while they are interacting with the child. It is based on Social Learning Theory and Attachment Theory principles, and is evidence-based, which means that it has been proved effective in several trials. It is also recommended by the NICE guidelines. Its effects can be seen fairly quickly, so it is very popular with parents. The aim of PCG is to improve the observational and discriminative skills of parents and to increase the sociable and cooperative behaviours of the child through the use by parents of their newly learnt

skills of differential attention. Parents/carers will learn to express interest, warmth and approval when their child is displaying appropriate/ acceptable behaviours and safely ignore or extinguish inappropriate behaviours.

INCREDIBLE YEARS

Incredible Years is an evidence based parenting programme, focusing on strengthening parenting skills and fostering parent involvement in children's school experiences, to promote children's academic, social and emotional skills and reduce conduct problems.

Group sessions focus on strengthening parent-child interactions, nurturing relationships, reducing harsh discipline, and fostering parents' ability to promote children's social, emotional, and language development.

Triple P

'Triple P' is the Positive
Parenting Programme that the
Pre-School Learning Alliance has
delivered in the south of the
Borough for the past 5 years.
It is for parents and carers who
would like support on how to
manage their child's behaviour
and learning alongside other
parents in a non judgemental
atmosphere.

The Programme supports parents and carers to:

- cope with the stresses of parenthood
- avoid power struggles and set boundaries
- develop creative and imaginative play opportunities with their children.



Run over 5 weeks the sessions consist of 2 hours in the classroom with an additional 2 weeks support by telephone and are aimed at parents with children aged 2 – 8 years. Courses are held throughout the year at:

Toy Library

Our Toy Library is available for Children's Centres, Schools, as a Borrow and Play session in financial **Churches and Community** Groups to buy in a Toy Lending suitable space or we have a Service for their families.



Our borrowing period is one month so we can visit your venue once a month or once a week depending on your budget.

The sessions can be run either your venue if you have a Toy Library Bus that can be used to access communities which are hard to reach or areas where a suitable venue is not available.

We currently run 6 sessions during the week across the 4 Children's Areas. Families can access the Tov Library by paying a small yearly membership fee and supplying proof of address and ID. We are also able to offer free membership to families

Domestic Violence and Abuse

The Community Groups Programme is a 12-week community based programme for children and their mothers who have been exposed to domestic abuse.

The programme gives children an opportunity to process and understand the violence and abuse they have experienced. The group is delivered by trained facilitators from across the Borough, managed by PSLA. The 12 week programme will start in March/April 2015, depending on the number of referrals for each age group.

PSLA currently facilitate a **Domestic Violence and Abuse** Network. Originally aimed at bringing providers together in the borough to share information and develop shared practice, the network will also focus on supporting professionals to identify and support families at an early stage, how Local Authority networks and fora can

incorporate early identification of families experiencing DV, developing referral pathways all referrals for the programme across services, and developing tools or protocols to support this. The group meet quarterly with the next meeting being planned for March 2015. Roots of Empathy in Lewisham

We have completed the first two years of the Roots of Empathy programme in Lewisham and have reached over 1000 children in 16 primary schools so far. Each year the number of schools involved and programmes delivered increases and in our 3rd year there are 26 programmes in 17 schools meaning another nearly 800 children in Lewisham will benefit from the Roots of Empathy programme in 2014/15.

At the heart of the programme are classroom visits by a parent and baby. Through guided

Despite being the founder and president of Roots of Empathy Mary Gordon remains very involved in all aspects of Roots of Empathy and has visited several 'Roots of Empathy' schools in Lewisham over the last 2/3 years. We were thrilled that through lottery funding Mary was able to host/deliver a Professional Workshop day on Emotional Literacy in the Classroom for Lewisham class teachers and other interested people in

October 2014. In December she also visited Lucas Vale Primary School to view a Roots of Empathy family visit to a Year 5 class.

When asked by



the children why she started Roots of Empathy she replied 'Children are not just part of our future, they are all of our future'.

A local head teacher had this to say about the programme in her school 'With the support of Roots of Empathy, we will have a greater understanding of the spectrum of children and families we work with in our community. Roots of Empathy allows our children to have a greater understanding of their own personal experiences, which enables them to positively interact and understand other people developing the value of empathy.'
